


Certificate II in Horticulture AHC20416

Aim

The program is designed to provide students with an understanding of the practices that occur in horticultural operation and allow them to experience and develop horticultural skills in real workplace situations.

Location:	Ranges Tec 1/9 Hightech Place, Lilydale Wednesdays 12:30pm – 5:00pm Ranges TEC offers this course on behalf of Mount Evelyn Christian School/Ranges TEC RTO Number 22559.Certificates will be issued under the Mount Evelyn Christian School/Ranges TEC banner.
Credit towards VCE /VCE VM:	On completion of the certificate, students are eligible for four VCE VET units on their Statement of Results. Students who complete this certificate are eligible for recognition of two or more units at Units 1 and 2 level and a Units 3 and 4 sequence. Students who receive a Units 3 and 4 sequence for VCE VET Horticulture will be eligible for an increment towards their ATAR (10% of the average of the primary four scaled studies). The increment is awarded by the Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC). Further information can be found on the VTAC website: www.vtac.edu.au
Cost:	Students need to check with their home school regarding cost of course and required resource costs.
Equipment/special requirements:	Personal Protective Equipment, including wet weather jacket, boots, sunhat, gloves, earplugs and safety glasses, VET log book and evidence folder.
Additional requirement:	This program may also require additional attendance at TAFE out of normal school hours (evening and/or during school holidays).
